Protecting Your Family From Fire

Some ways that fire starts are by putting pot holders by the stovetop burners or oven, kids playing with matches, burning food, candles, and cigarette butts. A potholder can cause fire because potholders are made of cotton which is very flammable and if you leave it by the flames it will catch on fire. It's good to place potholders on a counter and away from stovetop burners. Another cause of fire is having too many cords in an outlet or improper use of an extension cord may also overheat and spark into a fire. One way to not have outlet fires is to limit the number of cords used in an outlet. To protect your children from matches (which can start fire) is to put the matches somewhere you know but your children will not know. When food is unattended for a long time such as food on the grill, it will start burning and catch on fire. Candles catch on fire because often a little breeze will blow something over the candle and catch on fire. Some examples something can be by a candle is some paper, a leaf from outside (if it's not winter), lamp shade or something flammable near by. Careless smoking causes fires start. Cigarettes butt fires kill about 900 people each year, unexpectedly, and cigarette butts are harmful to the environment.

In case of a fire or any kind of an emergency call 9-1-1. You should call 9-1-1 after you leave your house or apartment, go to your neighbor's house and ask to use the phone. If you have little children and they know how to use the home phone put stickers on your phone so your child will know the number in case of an emergency.

Having a smoke alarm in your home or apartment is a law in New York and it can help because smoke alarms can tell you there is a fire in your home. It's good to have a smoke alarm on every level of your house or apartment, inside each bedroom and outside each sleeping area. To make sure your smoke alarm works, check the batteries and test your smoke alarm once a month. You should also replace your smoke alarm every 10 years so it's new and up dated.

E.D.I.T.H is away to remember your escape plan. E.D.I.T.H means Exit Drills In The Home. Making an escape plan can help save you and your family from fire because it is a plan of where to go to escape from your burning home or apartment and your meeting place once outside. Your escape plan should have two ways out including doors and windows in case one is blocked by fire. You should practice your escape plan twice a year in case a fire happens. When you are getting out of your house or apartment it is good to crawl down and stay out. You crawl out because hot air rises so the smoke will be in the air which makes it hard to breathe.

Carbon Monoxide Detectors can alert you to the presence of toxic gas. There are dual models which can detect smoke and carbon monoxide. This poisonous gas is odorless, colorless and tasteless. Carbon monoxide is a silent chemical that can kill people unexpectedly. Carbon monoxide is a gas that is present in the air, but it's the high levels that can make this gas deadly.
